Full & Part Time Summer Job Opportunities

We view our summer staff as ministers, not just workers. Each summer, we put together a team that serves the camp in a variety of ways. The summer staff work together to make the camp a great place for the campers and faculty. Here are the positions available for this summer.

Kitchen Workers: These individuals serve great food along with lots of smiles three times a day!

Lifeguards: Red Cross certified lifeguards keep watch and maintain the safety of everyone at the pool. The camp will reimburse training costs for those who complete training and commit to the summer.

Zipline Guides: Every day is a new adventure assisting campers for their trip on "The Leap of Faith." Each guide must pass thorough training classes at the camp before becoming a certified guide.

Cleaning: The cleanest camp around doesn't just happen by itself! No better place to work and there is always plenty to do.

Grounds: The camp has 40 acres to maintain so every day offers plenty of trimming, weeding and mulching opportunities. The number one complement the camp receives is how nice the grounds look.

Security: Safety is very important and we take it very seriously. This year we have an opening for the right person with the right credentials to guard the front gate at various times through the week.

All positions have the potential to be full or part time depending on each individual's availability. Also, schedules can vary from day to day and week to week depending on the age groups and program happening at the camp. Workers must be at least 16 years old.
