



First Christian Church in Elizabethtown which has supported and sent kids to camp from the very beginning had an amazing year in 2014. They have been adjusting to a new building and new location which is a great site but even more exciting is that this past year they had 143 additions and 60 baptisms. Wow! The Senior Minister, Stuart Jones, attributes a lot of this to a strategic and consistent approach in teaching. After every service he leads a 10 minute class about how the Church needs to lead people to Jesus by loving God, loving people and serving the world. Then once a month a 1 hour class is offered on one of three topics, led by an elder of the church, on the Restoration Movement, Why is Baptism (immersion) Important and the Gifts of Service.
